



THE "DOUBLE BAZOCKA" ANTENNA - 40 AND 80 METERS by WD4ODF *

The original makeup of this antenna is listed in the "General Handbook". Some of the guys

here are even using it on 20/15/10 meters.

Here are the diagrams, dimensions and construction details. (Please read entirely, before commencing construction.):




80 Meters:

40 Meters: A = 22 6"




TRIM 12" OF INSULATION FROM BOTH COAX & TWIN LEAD, TWIST ALL CONDUCTORS TOGETHER & SOLDER.

NOTE C. -

TRIM ABOUT 12" OF INSULATION, TWIST CONDUCTORS TO GETHER, INSERTINTO NECK OF EYELET & SOLDER.



NOTE F. -

SOLDER PL 259 ON INBOARD END OF EACH COAX ANTENNA LEG.

- To set SWR, trim each end of twin lead the SAME amount, in 1" increments. After each trim, replace eyelet.
- 2. If 80 m. Bazooka is not sufficiently broad-banded, unsolder one end of each RG 58 and shorten each by 3", then resolder. Retrim twin lead, if necessary.
- 3. 40 m. Bazooka will have about 400 kHz band width, with SWR less than 1.5:1.
- 4. Seal entire "Handy Box" before puting antenna in the air.
- 5. For Inverted Vee configuration, the angle should be greater than 100° .
- "Popsicle sticks may be used at the junction of twin lead and coax, wrapped with tape to strengthen the joint.
- The antenna radiates on the shield of the RG 58; the center conductor acts as a "filter" of sorts, and is a direct electrical short.

I've found several items that have caused some problems and delays in issuing awards. First, is the duplication of calls on a 500 or 1000 point Award. As you send in your applications, you should make a permanent record for yourself, in your log book or any other convenient place. The second problem is just plain sloppiness. I've had complaints from several of the Area Awards Managers on this one. The applications are such a mess of erasures, crossouts, coffee cup stains and Heaven knows what else that

10 is very difficult to tell what is on the application. I suggest you get a tablet or notebook (legal pads are good) to do your preliminary record keeping, and then fill in the application (print or type, please) when you are ready to send it in to the Awards Manager.

Neatness and good record keeping will help speed your applications through the Awards

Manager, and to me, so that you get the Certificate you've worked so hard for, as promptly as possible.

	tions will be validated at the Feb. Board meeting and new officers will take office at the beginning of the next Club fiscal year - March 1, 1981. WD8JYN and VE3KFO will act as Election Monitors on 75 meters; W6PIO and WB3AMO will be the Election Monitors on 40 meters.

Net Log by KB9HI Ballots for the election of Directors for the odd-numbered and DX Call-Areas must reach the Directors' Election Monitor, Pres. Dennis, AJ8Y, on or before Jan. 11, 1981 Zulu date. To be valid, your ballot must show YOUR Certificate number (& which band), your QTH, your choice of Director and a statement that he/she is willing to serve, if elected.
