m the QSL Bureau Manager for 160 Meters, 75 CW, 40 CW and 40 RTTY. Since I began this job in September 1992, I have accumulated quite a few cards that I have been unable to send because I don't have SASE's for these call signs. Before I start returning cards marked "Not In Buro", I would like to give everyone a chance to send in SASE's. I enjoy running the bureau - let me know what I can do to make it more enjoyable for you. At the present time I have 296 members cards in the bureau that I don't have envelopes for. By call areas they break down to, 1st-29. 2nd-22, 3rd-21, 4th-66, 5th-34, 6th-6, 7th-32, 8th-38, 9th-24 and 10th-34. Many of these cards are for members that we hear regularly on our nets. If you send an envelope with three or four units of postage and I only have a few cards for you, then you will be overpaying for postage. I am telling you this to save you a financial burden.

{By the way, a note to all bureau users - it helps to put one unit of postage per envelope unless you know you will be getting a lot of cards. If you put two units or more and I don't get many cards for you, then I can either send you a few cards and

you've lost postage, or I can hold your cards until there are enough to send, and you might be waiting for quite a while. The best thing to do if you want cards faster is to send lots of envelopes, each with one unit of postage. Be sure to put your call sign in the upper left corner. Thanks.}

(Some of you probably now have SASE's in the bureau. If you have already sent me SASE's, great! Thanks so much for your help) If Not, send your SASE's to the QSL Bureau C/O N5OHN, Marty Blaise, 8611 Twisting Vine, Houston, Tx 77040-4619.

I would like to thank all of those who have sent additional postage and little favors to help out with DX (including Canada - they can't use U.S. Stamps, remember?) and for those new to the nets and the bureau. Also, many thanks for those who send cards in order by call district (1.2.3). It really makes sorting go faster. One final tip - try not to send tiny envelopes as your SASE's. Some people QSL with fairly large-sized post cards. That's all from the 160-CW-RTTY bureau. Hope to see everyone at the eyeball



t was the middle of the after noon when Fred KB5MRU and I first be-

gan to hear the 40 meter Century Club Net. We had about 68 degrees with sunshine and NE trade winds blowing through the G5RV antenna up about 35 feet. The net starts at 2pm in Hawaii so it is no surprise that not many hams even try to check in form here. However, about 3pm (0100z) is when I could hear the net. I immediately began trying to check in. About 10 minutes later N7WOC heard me and relayed us in signals were weak, yet I could copy just about everyone on the net and was even able to take down the list. Since it was still daylight in Hawaii, the broadcast noise level had not come up vet. Of course going back to the mainland was a problem because we had only 100 watts fighting against the noise level in the lower 48.

Our Hawaii trip began with 3 days on the island of Oahu. before we went to Hawaii, Fred had talked with three hams that told us to stop in if we could. I had hoped to operate HF from the capitol, but it just did not work out. We did meet AH6IO at the local Ham Store in Honolulu for a nice eyeball. He even tried to set me up with an HF remote base that I was going to work the net from a hand held sitting in the Hotel. That would have been a first on the net! It did not work because the HF rig had been disconnected for service

After Three days of being tourists traveling around the island of Oahu in a Jeep, we got on a plane headed for beautiful Maui. What a big difference in life-style and atmosphere! If you come to Hawaii, I highly recommend that you stay away from the expensive Honolulu tourist trap along Wakiiki Beach. We should have stayed the whole time on Maui.

On Maui we stayed at a great bed and breakfast that belongs to Bill AH6UU. He is active with emergency operations and the local VE program on Maui. In addition to the wonderful place that he rents out, he

We wanted to make sure that everyone got the chance to make a good contact, but did not want to give away Hawaii to some that like to say "was that an also 22 ??" when everyone else heard a 4 by 5. Sure, if you have QRM or static crashes that's fine to have another long string, but if you can't really hear the station - do not waste net time guessing the report. Combos normally send and receive the same reports on each report regarding combos, so as a check to see if you folks were really copying us we sometimes sent back different numbers and only sent out a few two by two's. Our noise level was

about at the 1 level with most signals at 2 to 3. The stronger stations were doing

about S4 to S5. Maybe you heard the contact we had with our club President Paul WI4Y. He was no doubt the strongest one we heard. He was moving the s-meter up to a 7 and sometimes S9. So when he called me, I gave him a 5/9. Then Fred gave him a "piece of lumber - 2 by 4." Paul got it; but it was a surprise. Sorry about that Paul - you really earned your cards! Jimmy N9NHJ got woke up by his dad Jim KF9EB. Say thanks to your dad. We were able to make contacts on both 40 and 75 meters. but on 160 meters we could not hear the net. It was great fun and hope that everyone that needed Hawaii, got a contact. I really appreciate all the nice cards and comments that I received. If we ever go again, we will take an amp and some better antennas.
