The Ultimate Mobile Award

One day I was thinking about what is the most challenging award that the club officers. Some folks are already looking for those last few states to get their 10K award. With so many fine operators giving us mobile and portable contacts, how about a real challenge for them? I suggest we offer the "SUPER 50 WAS". To qualify for this award you must operate either mobile or portable in each and every state and make contacts from each and every state. For example, make contacts with all 50 states in Maryland and then Oklahoma and then Delaware, etc. until you have done all 50. This would be a total of 2500 QSL cards! Now let's drop back down to reality and say OK, to 35 states for the basic award. Operate from 35 states and make contacts from 35 states for a total of 1225 cards. I know a few guys that have already operated mobile from more than 20 states. Normally on any one night that mobile could easily work 20 or 30 different states so my suggested award is a big challenge, yet with in reach for a serious 3905 Century Club operator that likes to travel around the country.

Letter from David WN1F

The following letter was received by Ricardo K8MZA and reprinted in part, with the permission from David WN1F.

May 16, 1994

Ricardo - K8MZA

Please accept my apology for excessive delay on returning QSL's. Been an operator for past four years and have always prided myself with my responsiveness to send confirmations. Past year has been very difficult for me, due to work and other activity demands. I have been absent from my routine and often obsessive transmitting.

I will review my computer logging program to determine how many other Century Club 3905 contacts I have made, but failed to confirm with QSL cards. I have massive amounts of QSL's to sort through, and log in, to determine what I have already confirmed and which I have not. I tried to log while mobile but gave up. I know that I made perhaps a dozen or so from Concord, N.H. and Augusta,

Maine in June 1993. In September 1993, I also made a few CC 3905 contacts from Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana and Oklahoma while mobile.

I believe from listening in the past, that several ops continue to look for contacts from the Northeast. I am willing to travel back to Augusta, or Concord almost anytime with a days notice if anyone "needs" these Capitols. I am willing to arrange traveling to Vermont and other NE states some afternoon following if there is demand on the CC 3905. I am usually found on 20, 40 or 80 meters CW mobile using the Hustler, but am also able to make any WARC or other HF frequencies using the Outbacker.

I am interested in returning back to the net very soon. If anyone is still looking for my delinquent QSL, have them send a note, or just ask when I get back on.

Letter to the Editor

(Editors note: At first I was not going to print this letter because I felt it should have gone through the Net Control Coordinators first. But, after reading it over a few times I found it had some good points that maybe we need to consider as club members. Some of the suggestion must be approved by club officers and included in the Net Controllers Guide. But, because this letter made me set back and think, I decided to include in this newsletter. I suggest that as a net control you might want to check with the Net Coordinators before implementing any of the suggestions.)

An Open Letter to Net Controls

Firstly, I'd like to thank each and every Net Control for your efforts as a volunteer which help us all make contacts we need.

Net. I'd like to offer a few suggestions to help speed up the Nets, cut down on the confusion, and enable us all to make more contacts per Net.

Most other nets I hear on HF, and even some on VHF, start out with a short preamble that includes a statement such as "This is a directed net, all stations are requested to not break the net, and Net Control will appoint the following relay stations for this net". Then they select two or three strong stations spread around the country and ask them to be relay stations.

There are a few regulars who constantly break the net every three or four calls, and several who run on and on about nothing in general for long periods of time. This drives people of the nets and takes up lots of time that could be used for making contacts.

So, when you are Net Control, take charge of the Net, be in control, and don't let a few stations spoil it for everyone else. If they continue to break in all the time, tell them that you are Net Control, and if they would like to take over you will stand by. That usually shuts them up and gets rid of the problem then and there. If you appoint two or three Relays, then ask other stations not to break in or relay unless requested to, they will get message and let you run the Net.

Once again, thanks for a job well done, and for all the hours that you have freely given to running Nets.

To: RTTY Net Controls stations and Participants

From: W1BYH-RTTY Net Control Coordinator

In order to maintain a reasonable level of activity for the 3905 Century Club RTTY Net. We will begin operation of the 80 meter RTTY Net on May 15/16 Following the 40 Meter Net

Propagation and severe interference conditions on forty meters have made successful operation difficult at times, and suggestions have been made to try 80 meters.

Re-activation of the 80 meter RTTY Net has been under consideration for some time, and I feel it is worth a try. This is not to eliminate the 40 meter net, but re-activate the 80 meter operation. I expect the Forty meter RTTY activity and conditions will be better again in the fall.

To maintain continuity, we will start the 40 meter net at the normal 0100z time, and QSY to 80 meters at 0130z. In order to better notify participants of the change. Depending on propagation, the time for the 80 meter net may be adjusted for a later start in the future weeks. updated information well be provided on all nets.

We will be looking for additional Net Control Stations for both 40 and 80 meter RTTY nets!

Please note: The 80 meter RTTY net is a separate net from the 40 meter net, so all contacts and awards are specific to each net. This may increase the initial activity on the 80 meter net significantly.
