I was asked by our editor to say a few words about myself and my experience on the CCN.

I wanted to thank everyone who voted for me to take over the 9th area director position. Well, there was no vote and I just took it over. So I guess I'm the one who should be thanked hihi.

I was born 65 years ago in Milwaukee. At the age of 15 I got a novice ticket in 1961. At that time the novice ticket was only good for 1 year. You needed to update during that time, or off the air you went. Well, I had to go to Chicago for the test. No trouble with the code, but failed the written. Then when I was getting ready to take it again, I found girls a lot more fun than ham radio.

A couple years later I enlisted in the Navy. When word got out that I already knew the code, they sent me right to radio school. The next year was school, then 2+ years in Hawaii, and last year in Vietnam sitting in the gulf of Tonkin.

10 years later I took the novice test and passed. However, I had very limited funds and just couldn't afford any equipment.

So another 10 years passed and I finally got my first rig a Yeasu 101ee. It didn't take long, and my code speed was well over 20 wpm.

I finally took the big step and took the General test and passed 1989. Note I also passed the 20 wpm code for the extra. I had no intention of going for advance or extra. I had that credit sitting on my desk for months. Finally I decided not to let that credit go to waste and passed the final two tests.

My first contact on the CCN was with Joe K5FNS and Lynn KB5GVR. Carol N5GAP was NCS that night and she always had a major bombing signal.



I have held a number of officer's positions over the years From the 9th area directors (2 times), to Vice President. Around 1995 I was asked if I would like to take over qsl manager duties for the new digital nets that were starting. I agreed, A couple years later our 75 meter qsl manager Carol KD3FM passed on and the 75 meter qsl bureau was handed over to Arnold . Well for one reason or another, he decided to give it up. The president at the time K5SV ask me if I would take over the duties of this band also, and after relocating the bureau at home 3 times, I finally got a good room for it.

keep the cards moving!

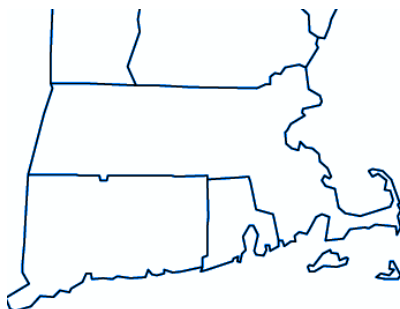
Immediately following the forum, we will hold the Annual Club meeting – all members are encouraged to attend. Bring your thoughts and opinions. See how the business of the club takes place.

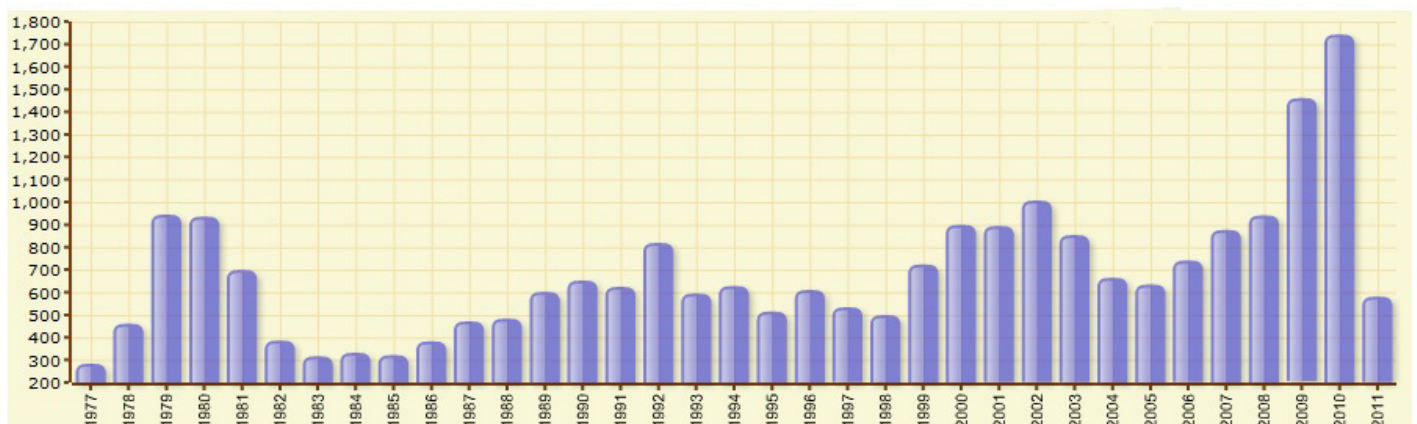

The Year in Review

This filing status properly identifies us as a "Social and Recreation Club" which is as it was when this club charter was written.

Our Resident Agent, Ricardo Mena, K8MZA is aging and our last contact with him let us know we needed to locate a replacement. The board was able to locate James Johnson, W4JBZ and he achieved his membership so he could be considered for this position. Our thanks go out to Jim for accepting this position. Per the articles of incorporation, our RA must reside in the state of our incorporation which is the state of Florida.

One of this administration's first tasks was to get our finances on solid footing. We established a financial committee which will allow continuity as we move forward. Having more than one person familiar with the duties and inner workings of this position covers us when one or more isn't available. This committee has done a great job in getting our books into a real bookkeeping system and churning out reports for the board of directors to review. Our bookkeeping is now accessible online which gives any of the finance committee to review and update these records to work on our budget and properly categorizing our income and expenses. There were many participants and several that had never gone much beyond a 100-point suddenly found lots of unused cards and applied for new awards. My thanks go out to all that entered, and to the winners. Keep your eye on this committee as other ideas are developed.

Years ago the club had something called a flower fund. Many clubs have these and donations seem to dwindle to a point that these programs are usually dropped. We created a "Century Club Cares" program to achieve the same purpose. Any member suffering from sickness or

injury is likely to receive a card from this group. Sometimes we don't get word until it is too late, so please be sure to send a note to Gene Marsh, W8NET if you know someone that should be placed on this list.

We had a successful Eyeball in Mississippi/Louisiana, tagged as the "Miss Lou" eyeball and hosted by Frank Krize, K5SVC. The eyeball was a great success and the weather was just fantastic. What made this eyeball stand out was the fact that it was self-supporting. Frank was able to negotiate with vendors for prizes and our ticket sales were such that no money was pulled from the club treasury. I think this might be a first and Frank has certainly set a great example for others to follow.

One award that I am particularly proud to have seen was the club's first CW 1k award to be issued since the club started in 1977. I was in a tight race with Art Bloom, KK2M (Master #7) and he is the proud holder of 40m CW 1k #1 and the only wild card so far on that mode. Please drop by and work Art to congratulate him for his achievement.

We added 8 more masters to the list during the last year and more are on the horizon. This award requires lots of time and dedication to the nets. Many of our masters seem to disappear after they achieve this award, but a handful of us still continue on.

Looking at Bureau visitors, I see 994 unique calls that show activity over the past year. Our bureaus are strong and well run. At the time of this writing, W5IL is getting ready to step down after 6 years of service in that position. We wish him a well-deserved rest from sorting cards and dealing with our shipments. We have world class bureau managers WM9H, W5IL and N9KNJ. They all do our club a fantastic service and set the bar pretty high for others to follow.
