2012 Election

Voting in Election 2012 began at midnight (Central Time) December 31, 2011 for the election of Club President, Even-Numbered Area Directors and 3rd Area Director, and all balloting ended midnight CST, Feb. 15th.

Voting for Director was conducted on-line or by postal mail to the Election Monitor (address below). Votes for Director on-line or by postal mail must have been received on or before Jan. 31st, 2012.

Voting for President was conducted on-line or by postal mail to the Election Monitor (address below) with a final opportunity to cast a ballot on-air on the 40M and 75M SSB Early Nets on Feb. 15th local date. Votes for President on-line or by postal mail must have been received on or before midnight (CST) Feb. 15th, 2012.

All members were strongly encouraged to vote on-line or by postal mail to avoid disappointment if conditions for the nets on Feb. 15th (CST) were poor, and conditions were up and down like a yo-yo on the 75M net, but all who wished to cast a ballot were able to do so.

All individual members holding a 100-Point Certificate on any Century Club net were eligible to vote for President. To vote for an Area Director, members must reside in the call area for which that candidate for Director was running. Only individual members may vote and a 100-Point Certificate number and the band/mode on which it was held was required when voting. Clubs and Special Event calls, even if holding a 100-Point Certificate, were not eligible to vote. All ballots were verified against the Club membership roster.

Mobiling as a Combo

I have an Icom 706MkIIg which I bought in 2001. My brother John N7JY has a Kenwood TS-430S he's had for many years. We've traded off and used both radios at one time or another during our combo trips. Antennas used have been Lakeview Hamsticks for 40m and 75m, a tuned whip antenna using an Icom AH-4 automatic tuner, and a Don Johnson screwdriver antenna. Of all of these, the Screwdriver seemed to work best, but I have had good success with the others.

Output power used has typically been 50-100 watts. We had too much of a voltage drop with full power on N7JY's setup until John beefed up the deep cycle battery situation; when transmitting at full power, it sometimes dropped the voltage down below 11 volts and the radio would shut off. He solved that by adding more batteries in parallel.

Some of the highlights of our mobiling as a combo over the years:

California to Illinois and back in 2002. We operated from twelve states, including three state capitals and at one state line. We used my Icom radio which I'd owned less than a year at that time, and a Hamstick antenna for just 40 meters. Our operating locations included roadside pullouts, campgrounds, just parking on the street, or in various parking lots.

In Washington Kansas, it was rapidly approaching 11:00pm and we left US-36 and went into

the town, which as you can guess was completely closed for the night. We found a small bowling alley with an empty parking lot, so we parked there for the night and that's where we checked into the 40 meter late net. Sometime later during the night a vehicle went slowly into the lot and back out again; I figure it was likely the local police making sure we were harmless. Early in the morning we departed, and wouldn't you know, just a short distance east of town on US-36 there was a wonderful little roadside park we could have stayed in. But, we didn't know about it.

In one small Missouri town we decided to park overnight on a side street. Just as we were getting set up to get on the net, a local policeman came by to see what we were doing. He advised us to move down the street a little bit further (probably so he could keep an eye on us better). We did, but it placed us closer to an electrically noisy street light. Oh well.

The one and only night we operated from Iowa that trip, we had checked into a commercial campground in Keokuk. Rather than check in as a combo, we each checked into the net separately. This is so that we could take turns using the shower while the other was using the radio. I think this slightly annoyed a few of the other folks checked in that night, when things happened such as, "AD7DB is checking out, but N7JY wants to check in. No, they're not a combo tonight."

Various trips to Nevada, Utah, Arizona. On one trip I operated from two different state line pairs, in and near Mesquite NV, that were several miles apart. I've also operated from within Phoenix AZ several times.

The trip to the Eyeball in the Pacific Northwest in 2004. We operated (or at least attempted) from state capitals of California, Oregon and Washington.

Our big trip to Yellowstone in 2008. We operated as a combo from three National Parks to stir up activity for the new award, as well as activated some of the intermountain states and one more state capital.

Road trip in 2009 to try to operate from six National Parks in one week. We got to operate from just five of them: Grand Canyon, Bryce Canyon, Canyonlands, Arches, and Zion. Capitol Reef will require a return trip; there was too much QRN there that night. But we traveled and toured around by day, and got on the nets at night.

We have also operated from two other National Parks that should be considered "right next door" for anyone in Southern California: Joshua Tree, and Channel Islands.

I operated alone from Death Valley in 2010. Also during that weekend I operated from outside Las Vegas, trying to work N7JY who was mobile in Ohio at the time. (He took a real long trip, please read his article for details!) This was not my first time operating HF from Death Valley; in 2004 I did it as a stunt for a local repeater group. John's article will fill you in (he was my accomplice), or you can read all about that here: http://www.qsl.net/ad7db/newlow.html

I generally keep the windows up and the doors locked, especially when operating alone at night. One time I was operating from outside of St George, Utah. Earlier that day I'd searched for a spot to operate from the Arizona/Utah line on I-15 in that area, and didn't find a suitable spot, so I just operated from Utah that night. I found a quiet place on a dirt frontage road on the west side of the freeway. During the net that night, I caught some movement in the darkness – it was a coyote checking out my truck! Needless to say I didn't venture outside the truck without a complete check with a flashlight. (That particular location no longer exists; it is covered now by a new overpass for the road going to the new airport. Looking at the situation, the new road goes right down by the state line a little east of there, and should be a good spot if there are no power lines around.)

I think by far the most fun has been when we could both attend a 3905 Eyeball. We've been able to go to recent ones in Oregon, California, and Mississippi-Louisiana. We've been able to get in on the Antenna Shootouts, and the local QRP nets, as well as the regular evening nets, to provide contacts with our callsigns to many people. It's also great fun to meet people in person you have only talked to previously on the air.

Ham radio began in 1963 for me at age 12. I dropped dad's five tube "all American" AM radio from my backyard tree fort to the ground. Strange whistles and noises erupted from the speaker, then suddenly the sound of a man talking about our hometown. My pal, Charlie, said it was a local ham radio operator. A visit to his house later, and I was hooked.

My ham radio hero at the time was Clif Corne, K9E-AB, who was the first to do the impossible: work all U.S. counties. But Clif did it while living in an iron lung. As WN9PQY in 1965, I joined the initial awards net, then called the Certificate Hunters Club, later as WA9SXQ with my general class license.

In 1970, the Marines borrowed me for two years, but afforded me a dream position as a MARS operator at W4PKS in Camp Lejeune, NC and KG4EQ in Cuba. I wasn't very spit shine, but I could run phone patches like a banshee!

In 1977 I stumbled across the 3905 Century Club Net and made a few contacts. The net was in its infancy, and confusion reigned, so much so I gave it a year to last. (I've since given up predicting the future). I ate the 10-10 paper candy for a while, then other interests put ham radio in mothballs until 1988, when I mixed county hunting with the Century Club, attending the Starved Rock, IL eyeball in 1994. The informality and casual nature is what sold me on the Club--I was impressed by the Board of Directors meeting there, held around a campfire.

Mobiling was my haunt then, and I ran over 1200 counties, often joining the CCN net during the evening. As gas prices rose, there was more time for the CCN!

I see the Master award as a celebration of teamwork of our club officers, net controls, mobiles, portables, QSL managers and all associated. Most difficult was working the required DX on 75 meters, but that was solved as a number of us near finishing put our heads together and--with help from many--managed to attract a number of DX to the net. If one is having a problem with an award here--such as Poker Player--merely put the word out on the reflector and help will arrive.

Javier, HR2J, was my last contact for the Masters on February 10th. It was also my father's birthday. Dad passed in my arms of a sudden heart attack when I was 14. In fact, the day before he worked on the roof to set up my antenna to make my very first QSO, which came in the wee hours of that morning. Rather than wake him in my glee, I decided to wait. He never knew. So Dad, this one's for you.
