Balloting for all offices will begin at 12:01 AM on January 1st and will run thru midnight January 15th, Central Time.

To be eligible to vote, you must be an individual Club Member (must hold a 100-Point Certificate from any of our nets). Clubs and Special Events are not eligible to vote. You will need to know your 100-Point Certificate number and the band/mode on which it is held when voting.

Balloting will be by On-Line Ballot, or by hand-written ballot mailed to the Election Monitor -

There will be a final opportunity to vote for Vice President at the beginning of either the 40M SSB Early or the 75M SSB Early nets running on Feb. 15th local date. You are encouraged to vote on-line to avoid the

chance of propagation problems (etc) on the nets or delays in postal mail delivery. Please don't vote on the air if you have already voted on-line or by mail.

Mailed ballots must ARRIVE no later than Jan. 15th, and you must include your call sign, 100-Point Certificate Number and the band and mode on which that certificate is held, along with your votes. Please indicate the name of the candidate and the office he/she is running for along with your vote. Please include your state of residence if you are voting for Area Director. An e-mail address or telephone number would be helpful in case you need to be contacted. No attempt will be made to contact anyone not including such information. All voting on-line or by postal mail who provide an e-mail address will be sent a confirmation of their vote via e-mail.

If runoffs are required, the runoff balloting will take place from Feb. 1st thru Feb. 10th.

All dates and times above are based on Central Standard Time.

According to the bylaws of the club the Vice-President – shall act in place of the President, in the latter's absence.

This may not seem like much on the surface but the voice of the Vice President should represent all of us and should be able to work in unity with the President and the rest of the Board. This year we have two great candidates. Take time to read their statements and vote.


