EYEBALL 2014

Eyeball 2014, hosted by Keith (KS9WI) and Elaine (N9QZF) Summers, will be held in De Pere, WI (in eastern WI) the weekend of July 17-19, 2014. The event location will be in the Pine Room of the De Pere Community Center, 600 Grant St, De Pere, WI 54115. The ticket price is \$60 per person pre-paid & children under 16-yrs are free. De Pere, founded in 1883, pop 25,525, is a suburb of Green Bay located in Brown County at the SW tip of Green Bay, a large body of water connecting to Lake Michigan. It is split roughly in half by the Fox River with a 1/3-mile long 4-lane bridge connecting the two halves. The IL-WI border is about 140 miles to the south. the closest dry portion of the MI-WI border is about 150 miles to the NNW in Land O'Lakes. WI. It's about 335 miles to the dry portion of the MN-WI border in the NW corner of WI. The IA-WI border is all wet.

Our meeting room in the De Pere Community Center is 35' x 53', seats about 160, is air conditioned, and has access to a kitchen adjacent to the room for food service. Free WiFi is available. Beer and wine consumption is permitted; smoking is prohibited.

LODGING: Travel Lodge will be offering a group rate of \$59 per night. Mention "HAM RADIO GROUP"" when reserving to get the group rate. Includes free breakfast, free WiFi, fitness center, handicapped rooms - bench in tub, no roll-in shower. Located at 2870 Ramada Way, Green Bay, WI 54304, (920) 499-3599. Ramada Plaza will be offering a group rate of \$79 per night. Mention "HAM RADIO GROUP"" when reserving to get the group rate. Includes free WiFi, fitness center, handicapped rooms. Located at 2750 Ramada Way, Green Bay, WI 54304, (920) 499-0631. Ramada Plaza will also provide Shuttle Service to and from the Community Center and Green Bay Airport - ask for details on Community Center shuttle upon arrival.

ATTRACTIONS

The NEW Zoo is located about 15 miles north of the motels at 4418 Reforestation Road, Green Bay, WI 54313, (920) 434-7841. Admission is \$6 for adults, \$4 for seniors or under age 16, under age 2 free. The miles of trails, picnic areas, trout ponds, and animal exhibits provide fun and enjoyment for the whole family. Visit the observation tower to see a good portion of the animal exhibits and lush habitat in one magnificent view.

Green Bay Botanical Garden is located about 5 miles north of the motels at 2600 Larsen Rd, Green Bay, WI 54303, (920) 490-9457. Admission is \$7 for adults, \$5 for seniors, \$2 for ages 5 thru 12. Opened to the public in 1996, Green Bay Botanical Garden's 47 acres of display gardens and natural areas capture the beauty of northeast Wisconsin's four distinct and wonderful seasons. Visitors will enjoy outstanding architecture that sets the stage for an all-star performance by plants specially chosen for their ability to thrive in the Upper Midwest.

Green Bay Packers FAN Hall of Fame is located about 3 miles north of the motels in the atrium of Lambeau field at 1265 Lombardi Ave, Green Bay, WI 54304,(920) 569-7500. Unfortunately it's closing in November 2013 for renovations and won't reopen until April 2015. You may want to inquire about attending Packers practice sessions, which are open to the public.

National Railroad Museum is located about 2 miles northeast of the motels at 2285 S Broadway, Green Bay, WI 54304, (920) 437-7623. Ride aboard vintage, full-size railroad equipment for a 25-minute tour of the Museum. Along the way, the conductor describes various rolling stock. points out highlights of the Museum, talks about railroad safety and discusses the hobo culture. The train ride is pulled by a diesel locomotive. No reservations are needed to ride the train. Admission to the Museum is \$9 for adults, \$8 for seniors (62+), \$6.50 for ages 3-12, free under 3. With train ride, \$11, \$10, \$8.50 and free. Inquire by phone before going because the museum is sometimes booked for private events, such as a wedding on Saturday July 19, 2014.

Bay City Amusement Park is located about 8 miles northeast of the motels on the shore of Green Bay at 1313 Bay Beach Rd, Green Bay, WI 54301, (920) 448-3365. Bay Beach is the 9th oldest continuously operating amusement park in the United States. It features live pony rides, boat (kiddie) rides, bumper cars, chairplane, ferris wheel, giant slide, helicopter (kiddie) ride, jeeps, lady bugs, race cars, scrambler, sky fighters, tilt a whirl, Yo-Yo, Zippin Pippin (a 2500-foot roller coaster with 5 hills up to 70 feet), and the Bay Beach Train. The Bay Beach Train (a mini train) is the favorite ride of the park. The train takes you on a short tour of the grounds along the picturesque bay and back to the train depot. All aboard! There is no admission charge to the park and parking is free. Ride tickets are \$0.25 each (yes, really), with most rides requiring one or two tickets per rider. The Zippin Pippin Roller Coaster requires 4 tickets. Tickets for the live pony rides must be purchased at the pony ride site. Pony ride tickets are \$2 each. Regular ride tickets aren't

accepted at the live pony ride. Sounds like the place to go if you have children.

Heritage Hill State Historical Park is about 3 miles east of the motels, just a bit over the bridge at 2640 S Webster Ave, Green Bay, WI 54301, (920) 448-5150. Heritage Hill State Historical Park is a 50 acre living history museum in Green Bay, Wisconsin, beautifully nestled on the banks of the Fox River. See their web site for details. Adult admission is \$9, \$8 for Seniors (62+), \$7 for ages 4-17, under 4 free.

Bay Park Square Mall is located about 2 miles north of the motels at 2401 South Oneida Street, Green Bay, WI, just one mile south of historic Lambeau field, (920) 499-2277. Bay Park Square Mall is home to Kohl's, Shopko, Younkers, Younkers Furniture Gallery and more than 90 specialty retailers including Aerie, Aeropostale, American Eagle Outfitters, Bath & Body Works, Buckle, Coldwater Creek, Express, Gap, Gymboree, LOFT, Old Navy, Tilly's, Victoria's Secret, and Zumiez. The mall also has many great restaurants to choose from including International House of Pancakes, Longhorn Steakhouse, Old Chicago, Texas Roadhouse, and 8 tempting food court eateries. Admission is free. Exit cost is up to you!
