About your father, he has a lonely job and has about 500 men under him as he is cutting grass at the cemetery.

About your sister, she had a baby this morning but I don't know whether it is a boy or a girl so I don't know if you are an aunt or an uncle.

Your Uncle John fell in a whiskey vat. Some men tried to pull him out, but he playfully fought them off till he drowned. We cremated him and he burned for three days.

Three of your friends went off the bridge in a pickup truck. One was driving and the other two was in the back. The driver got out. He rolled down the window and swam to safety. The other two drowned. They was in the back and couldn't get the tailgate down.

Not much more news this time, nothing much happened, write more often.
