## 1997 Eyeball

The plans for the 20th annual eyeball are well underway. For those of you that do not already know. The eyeball will be held in Oklahoma this year. the eyeball site is Sequoyah State Park, at Hulbert, OK. The park is located eight miles east of Wagoner, OK. Which is about forty miles east of Tulsa. The eyeball information packet is ready and can be obtained by sending me a SASE with two units of postage, and I will be glad to get it right back to you.

The site for the eyeball will be in the pavilion of area three. We originally had another area but, through a bureaucratic goof-up we are now in area three. Area three is just past the golf course and pretty much remote from the rest of the park, except for the camping area of area three. These are the only full hook-ups in the park. For those that plan to camp in area three(the park does not except reservations for this area) you need to contact

me and let me know what your intentions are. I have made arrangements with the park manager to set aside as many spots as we will need for that weekend and they will hold them for us. The Camping area is about 200 yards from the pavilion(easy walking distance).

Sequoyah State Park is a large park with about any thing you could want. there is a lodge with cabins and restaurant. There are hiking and bike trails, mini and an 18 hole golf course, tennis courts, laundry and paddle boat rentals. There's even an airstrip. there is also a nature center, with a resident naturalist, we hope to have them set up some programs for us. # Meet Dave N3TUA & Walt AA3FC

## Dave (N3TUA)

Dave Berish (N3TUA) just turned 41 last month and has been a Ham since 6 Nov. 1994 and in a span of about four months last summer, upgraded from Tech to Extra Class. Dave runs his Yaesu FT-990 barefoot but says an amp is #1 on his shopping list. Dave didn't mention his antenna or if he is married. A suggestion Dave if you're married: A few well timed hints and CQ and QST laying around and opened to the page with the desired amp may result in a surprise from the XYL!!! Dave is also an avid county hunter.

Dave started joining the Century Club nets a few months ago even though his work schedule allows him to participate only a couple nights a week. Nonetheless, he has managed to make several hundred contacts in the few months since he first checked into the Century Club.

## Walt (AA3FC).

Now meet Walt Kum: (AA3FC). Walt's been around for a while (Walt recently celebrated his 72nd birthday earlier this month) but he's also a relatively new ham. Even though he's only been licensed since 12 Jan 93, Walt has had a long standing desire to be a ham radio operator.

In 1942 when he was only 17, Walt decided it would be great to have a ham license. So, with his 25 cents per week allowance, he saved up and bought an ARRL handbook (Price: \$1.00). Walt memorized the code according to the instructions in the handbook and built a code practice oscillator in a wooden camera case which he found in the attic.

Shortly after graduating from high school Walt joined the Navy and became a RADAR operator aboard an attack transport (USS Custer, APA40). Whenever he had the chance, Walt would go to the radio room and practice copying code. By the time the war was over he was copying 35 WPM and working on 40.

Over the following years Walt studied for the ham test but never got the chance to go to Philadelphia, 125 miles away to take the test.

In November 1992 there was an article in the Sunday paper about a local ham conducting classes in the basement of a local church about 1/2 block from Walt's home. He attended the next meeting and the following week took his Novice test and the 5 WPM code test. The following month Walt went to the YE session prepared to take the Tech test and the 13 WPM code test. Encouraged by some fellows just out of the military to take the 20 WPM test, Walt got 9 out of 10 questions correct!! With the 20 WPM test out of the way, he went back each month until he got his Extra Class ticket. Since then, Walt has become a Volunteer Examiner.

Walt's advice to those who are struggling to advance is pretty simple: **Never give up!!** Walt's 51 year effort to become a ham is a shining example of that advice.

court next to the eyeball site. There should be plenty for everyone to do, there is something in this park for everyone.

Not only is there something in the park for everyone, but also in the area. The area is rich in Native American heritage.

Nearby Muskogee and Tahlequah have many museums and attractions from the early days of the Indian Territory. In nearby Sallisaw and Tulsa is horse racing, with Sallisaw running during the day and Tulsa running at night. Tulsa also has many attractions that you may want to take in. The town of Claremore, just northeast of Tulsa is the home of the Will Rogers museum and the Jim Davis Gun museum.

The Saturday afternoon meal will more than likely be simple, this is because of the logistic involved. But the final plans have not been made, and will be published at a later date, when we know a little more on what we are going to do. But my guess it will be grilled hamburgers, with baked beans and desserts(just a guess at this point).

Just a few words on the weather you can expect. The daytime temperatures will

reach the upper 90's with nighttime temperatures upper 70's. Light clothing is recommended. Afternoon thunder showers can sometimes be expected. These are heating of the day showers and do not last long.

A word on motels in the area. The lodge within the park was 78% filled for this weekend as of Feb. 1, 1997. That means they have 28 rooms and 12 cabins left. If you plan to stay at the lodge, I recommend you make your reservations early. The Indian lodge, about 3 miles from the entrance to the park, has mostly family type cabins with kitchenettes. They are closed for the winter but will open the first of April. The Wagoner Motel has been bought by Days Inn and is being remodeled at this time. They hope to be fully operational by the 1st of August. The Motel 8 is excepting reservations now and is offering a 10% discount to our club. Be sure and mention the Century Club for your discount.
