Right about now is the best time to quote one of my inspirations, the one and only Herr Doktor himself, Hunter S. Thompson, from his opening to The Great Shark Hunt: "Well...yes, and here we go again."

In a couple of earlier issues of the Centurion, yours truly sat down and tried to explain the rationale/logic/lapse of sanity behind the club's Cross Reference, the effort to list the point certificate holders by callsign in complement to the numeric rosters. As time wore on, three problems came to light:

- The lists had been typed in Windows 3.1 Notepad, which is (frankly) a *lousy* text editor that is sheer hell to work with.
- It has not been possible to keep up with all the call sign changes thanks to the various Vanity programs.
- We sorta missed a few Silent Keys the first time around...

Enter two tools – and a situation on the club's web page – that led to a complete overhaul not only of the C.R. but also the numeric rosters! First, the new computer at my QTH (an AMD K6400-3 unit with 64 meg of memory and Windows 98...sigh...replacing a Pentium 75 with 16 meg and Windows 3.1) came with Microsoft Word 97 (am biting my tongue and trying to remain calm, this side of the libel laws) and a working CD-Rom. That program's

abilities are quite extensive, and fit the needs of what had to be done. Second, the CD reader led to the latest Flying Horse CD, and the opportunity to check the rosters themselves!

As for the situation: For about the last year, the numeric rosters have been out of whack, printing-wise. No matter how many times you downloaded them, half the pages were cut off, or the last few lines overlapped, or the final page was messed up...

All this led to one word: ENOUGH!!!!!!!

First off, before the C/R rewrite began, a full 10 days were needed just to retype the entire numeric rosters of 100 point (basic) certificate holders in Word. The result is a somewhat cleaner layout combined with the ability to highlight calls as needed, in particular our Silent Keys and those calls that have expired or reissued (more on those expired calls in a bit). As this article goes to print, the remaining rosters will be laid out in a manner that will accommodate the expansion of those levels much easier. Getting them to show up OK on the web page - we're still working on that, so please be patient.

Second, the C/R overhaul – and that's the best word for the process – showed just how much life has changed and what was missed the first time around. No less than 30 more Silent Keys were found, and over 70 calls had changed, since the rosters were created in 1997. Just shows what a new CD call book will do for you!

Perhaps the most annoying discovery has been an almost 50 percent increase in the number of our members whose calls are either more than two years expired or simply no longer found in the various databases – meaning we've either missed a great deal more Silent Keys or quite a few members have become (preferably for *them*) Rusty Keys, which are defined as amateurs whose calls expired before they did!

This is where you – yes, YOU - can help!!

What you're about to hold is the roster of our members whose calls are expired or deleted, along with their pertinent information. A good number of these folks were likely from areas a good number of YOU are, so if you could do us a bit of detective work and pass along any information you can discover - especially if they are no longer with us - we'll use it to update our records.

Hopefully, articles on these rosters in one way or another will become a regular feature of the *Centurion* (and if the new editor has his way, he'll go for it given he'll need all the copy he can get), so let's sit back and see what kind of effect this request has. Given that this list will come out with the autumn issue, it might be good practice to have them in the newsletter twice a year – one in the spring, and one in the fall. The hope is that this will be in the center of the issue, so you can take them out and keep them close at hand, particularly if you get the chance to travel.

Before we get to that list, a tradition that started with the prior articles continues here. As the C/R came around to its final form, we began to see who was in sight, at least as the point certificate requirements were concerned, of earning the Masters' Degree. Out of that came the idea of publicizing those who were getting closer to our highest goal, as a way of keeping in mind who we can help out.

This revision, however, has given us impetus to also list those members who have worked 100 point awards on ALL of our nets at this moment except for the new 20 and 80 meter RTTY nets. We'll give those two about a year of seasoning and publicity to get good and popular and then add them to the list.

RF Safety Rules Now in Force for all Amateurs

Sepember 1st was the official date set by the FCC for all US Amateurs to fully comply with the FCC RF safety rules.

The regulation, which went into effect on January 1st 1998, required that you read and understand the rules. And, where necessary, perform technical evaluations to determine if your station is compliant with the new regulations, Before September 1st, if you filed an Amateur Radio application with the FCC you had to certify compliance. Under the regulations, your station must not exceed the maximum permissable exposure limits for transmitter operations. The MPEs are both frequency and power- dependent.

According to the ARRL the regulations will not impose a major burden on amateurs. Most of us are already in compliance with the MPE requirements, but, some of us that run High Power will have to conduct a simple station evaluation. The ARRL Web site at <u>http://www.arrl.org/news/rfsafety/</u> has a complete description of the rules and station evaluation resources.

A fantastic Amateur Radio RF Safety Calculator can be found at <u>http://n5xu.ae.utexas.edu/rfsafety</u>.

I used to site to calculate my compliance for all the frequencies that I use. Each of the calculations have been printed waiting for the FCC or maybe a unfriendly neighbor who wants to challenge my operations.

For the 40 meter net at 7.234 with an antenna gain of 5.00 dBi running 500 watts the calculation for Controlled Environment is 4.54 feet and for the Uncontrolled Environment is 10.09 feet. This sounds like a lot of us. The calculation use 2.2 dBi for a dipole. So the 5.00 dBi antenna I used for the calculations has some gain...a bit more than I actually have.

You have to comply with the RF exposure limits, however, if your average power is below the level for the band you will not have to perform a routine RF radiation evaluation. For 40 meters the level is 500 watts. For your check in and first call based on the average power formula your average power is about 8 watts while net control would be 58 watts.
