



Me and Masters

Well the day finally came when I worked that last elusive DX on 75 meters. January 30th. Oh yeah not to mention that was my lovely wife's birthday as well. She let me slide on the whole celebration until the weekend. She knew how hard I had been working at getting my Masters. She also knew what the last DX meant to me. I had been talking about it for weeks. So anyway-----how it all got started.

Well I was born on June 10th 1968 in Farmville VA. I have been around Ham Radio my entire life. No kidding my entire 40 years and some change. My eldest brother, which some of you know, Ron K4RWS was first licensed back in 1967 sometime. Not hard to do the math there and figure it out that I wasn't even born yet. I can remember as a kid watching Ron operate some rig that he and my father had built. The thing had a light bulb in it as one of the components. Every time he would key it down the thing would glow. Me being just a wee bit a lad, maybe and most likely still in diapers, it fascinated me so much. I can remember also Ronnie was making some sort of coil. Have no idea what it was for but I can remember him filing the coil form. So how did we get started in Ham Radio? Our father had a television repair shop and you know what those shops had. Parts galore for Ham Radio. Back in the good old days you had to make all your gear. I guess you could say our father got Ronnie started in the hobby. I have had many hours of listening to and tuning around on the Hams Bands for ever it seems like. Oh yeah I have to throw this in there. I forgot to mention this Ronnie and I aren't the only Hams in our family. Ronnie and I come from a rather big family. There is 6 boys and one girl. I am the youngest and our sister is the oldest. And Ronnie was the first of the boys born. Now out of the seven of us 3 of us are Hams. Our sister and one of our brothers. My sister's husband their daughter and husband are as well Hams. Now our other brother and his oldest daughter are as well. All the hams are still licensed and current in all the log books. Also our father became a ham late in life and his final call sign was N4UPX. Yep you guessed it I took on his call as a vanity call soon after his death in 1995.

So in 1990 I came home from MS to bring my wife down here to current QTH. My brother David talked me into taking the Tech No Code test. I just did barely pass it. How ever I did and my ham career started. I played around on 2 and 6 meters for 12 years.

Then with some coaxing from Ronnie back in 2002 I went and took the General test. I passed the written part with no problems what so ever. I thought it was rather easy to do. But the code part was the hardest part for me. But I didn't give it up. I practiced hard for the next month on my code and took it again and didn't pass it. Close but didn't pass it. The next day I had a chance to take the code again at another location near by so I went and took it again and guess what ??? I past it with the copy. Boy was I pleased to hear that I passed it. So I got on the phone to Ronnie in NC and told him I had passed it. Guess what he talked me into doing. Get on 40 meters and join me at 0000 Zulu on 7.2335. He explained to me it was the 3905 Century Club and check in to the net. So there is where I started my HF fun.

That day was April 8 2002. My first contact on the 40 Meter Early net was with AB8MW Frank in OH and I made 22 contacts the first night I was one of the nets. I have been hooked ever since. Then Friday the 13th back in February of this year I was listening to the board meeting when I was voted as Masters #36. Yes Friday the 13th what a lucky day for me. What was really weird that my DX award is numbered 136 on 75 meters. I think 36 is going to be my new lucky number. So there we are 7 years later and a lot of hard work.

My congrats go out the guys that made it with me this year so far. AL7QQ, N3YK, NI7F, K2CV, NX7F, AND W00I. Way to go guys. I am sure that there will be a few more before this year is over. I hope so anyway. This is going to be the year of the Master I think. We have all ready had at least one every month so far.

Now to all that helped me along the way. The first person I want to thank is my father, Bill Statzer (SK) N4UPX. He got all of us in my family started in this hobby. Then my brother Ronnie K4RWS to whom got me started with the club in 2002. Then to Glen WT0A if not for him and a few others I would have never completed the Master Degree. A few others that helped along the way N9JZ, WA0SMQ (SK), NT4Z, KM5MS (wx updates after Katrina while I was deployed), KD4POJ (fellow military engineer), N5OHL (for putting up with my award mistakes) N5UJB (one heck of area director) W6BUM (W9BUM????) WB5FDP, and the last two whom helped me get my last few DX stations N3YK and NI7F. Called me on the phone while I was working night shift at work. I know I have missed a few in there but anyway I will say thanks to all that have been there on the road and every where.

I found the 75m Century Club Net in late 2004 and have been hooked ever since with most all my radio time being spent with the CC. Master 38

David A. Reed



Dave Reed's interest in amateur radio began at about age eleven, when he attended club meetings, rabbit hunts and other amateur-radio-related activities with his father (WA5OK). His father arranged for a very well-known and respected elmer from the Radio Club of Tacoma - Jerry Siligman, W7BUN (SK) - to provide lessons on theory and code, which ultimately led to a Novice class license in 1976 with the call sign WB7NBF. With radio equipment on loan from the Radio Club of Tacoma, and a general knowledge about how to build a dipole antenna, Dave was quick to get on the air with his own station, making CW contacts with other amateurs all over the country.

As is commonly the case for young hams, other interests took precedence and Dave was off the air for several years. In 2006, on a trip to visit his father, who had moved to Oklahoma, the opportunity to attend the Ada, Oklahoma hamfest came up. Dave's father encouraged him to attend the VE testing session just to see if he could pass the Technician licensing examination. After taking a few practice tests at www.qrz.com, Dave barely squeaked by with a passing score and obtained a Technician class license with the call sign KE7GNV.

Passing the Technician class licensing exam was the spark that re-ignited the amateur radio fire. Immediately upon returning home from visiting his father, Dave bought a study guide and subsequently passed the General class licensing exam about a month later. He also applied for and was granted the vanity call sign W7TAX. A modest station was put together and Dave was back on the air!

On August 1, 2006, while spinning the dial, Dave happened upon a group of signals on 7.2335 MHz. It was the 40m SSB Late Net, with W4HWD as NCS. After listening for a while to get a feel for how the net operates, Dave checked-in and made twelve contacts that night, starting with KI7PM who was mobile in New Mexico. Those first twelve contacts contain some very familiar call signs: KI7PM, AC0BG, AL7QQ, KV4GO, WA6CDO, W7ZXL, W7DGX, KD7VIK, K6CA, K5SVC, KH6G and WB7PTC. The net was very well run, it was a lot of fun, and Dave was hooked - he became a regular participant on The 3905 Century Club nets.

It wasn't long before Dave decided to make obtaining the Masters Degree Award his top priority. Paul Kelly, NN5G provided invaluable advice as to how Dave should proceed, and it was there that the journey began.

Dave says the most difficult award for him to obtain was the DX Award on the 75-meter SSB Nets, and this was the final award needed to complete the Masters Degree Award. On 31 January 2009 Dave worked his 25th DX contact on the 75-meter SSB Nets: XE2/N5SWE.

On March 2, 2009, Dave was awarded Masters Degree Award #38. Dave says it took two years, six months to complete and in that time he made a total of 4,557 contacts.

To everyone,

First I want to say thank you to everyone in the 3905 Century Club. I was reviewing my logbook to do what Larry (K0HNM) suggested "savor" the moment, and pick out "defining" moments. The more I looked at the logbook the more I understand how important everyone is in making this experience possible.

I am a retired Air Traffic Controller and have been involved in aviation since I was a kid. I have been a pilot for over 40 years and I enjoy building and flying R/C aircraft. Nice thing about flying R/C aircraft in the event of a crash you can walk to the scene of the accident. These pursuits led to Amateur Radio. Compared to most people in the 3905 Century Club I am probably a new ham, earning my General back in October of 2002. My elmers (N0OXV and N0OU) steered me to the 3905 Century Club, as I wanted to try and work all states. When I checked in for the first time, I was met with a sincere sense of welcome. That may sound trite, but it is true. Among my first contacts were K5FNS and W5IL on 40M. I learned quickly about, triplets, magnum and my most popular (also, also). These types of responses seem to break through all types of QRM. Another early lesson was organization of contacts. I got the sense pretty early on (*after I inadvertently made a call to someone I had previously worked*) they would immediately let me know (*that while they appreciated the call*) we had worked before. I could tell by voice inflection that this "faux pas" is considered bad form. I needed a good logbook. Special thanks to Dean N7XG, without the organization his logging program has provided me, I probably still would be making this "gaffe". It was after these first few months of furious contacts and receiving QSL cards, that my goal of working 50 states seemed small compared to what was available through the 3905 Century Club. PSK, RTTY, CW, different bands, and mobile, I wanted to experience it all. To make this possible required more members of the 3905 Century Club. Thanks to Tom, AA1NZ and Rick, WB5FDP, for helping me overcome my fear of trying CW. Another thanks to VE4ABU for his RTTY and PSK programs which helped me through the RTTY and PSK nets. And thank you to Dean WC0PD and Nadine WA0SMQ for helping with my award applications.

I have learned many things in approximately the last 7 years that without the 3905 Century Club would not have been possible. For example, how propagation works as the evening wears on for 40m and 75M. Operating different modes like, PSK, RTTY, CW (of course my fist needs improving). Proper use of different antenna setups and how to work through QRM. How to operate mobile HF and be a NCS.

I enjoy working mobiles (like WC0PD, KI7S, KC2PUF, KG4NBL, K0MRC) as they travel all over the United States. I like to ride along with other mobile stations as they (like I do) plan vacations around states to allow other members to make contacts in various states. 




