For me the long road to my Masters was a long one, going back 10 years. I owe all of this to a good friend of mine who told me about the Century Club at our Tuesday morning coffee. His name is Bob N9BBV, some of our long time members remember Bob and he is the one who got me hooked. I listened to the 40 meter early net that night and checked in the next night, and was there most every night. In 2000, the Eyeball was in Cedar Rapids, IA and Bob and myself went and had the time of our lives and the people were great.

I mainly stayed on 40 meters and started working on awards, but never thought about Masters. My call sign then was K9TWV and I got about every award on 40 meters. One night they needed a NCS and I remember Gil W9YN yelled at me and said you can do it, and that was my first night as NCS. I had so much fun doing, I was doing it a few nights a week, next thing I knew, I was the 40 meter net coordinator for three years. Back then conditions were very good and we had very large nets and ran the entire 4 hours, sometimes splitting them with west coast stations. This worked out very well and we did this for a number of years.

In 2002 I was asked to run for 9th Area Director and was elected to two terms and was elected Board Chairman for four years. I started checking in to the 75 early net and started working on awards to match what I had on 40 meters. I was a regular on 40 and 75, and 160 when I had a chance. When we started the PSK nets, I got my 100 point awards on all of them, but concentrated on 40 and 75. One rule I have always had, is no radio on Friday nights, as that is family night, and family comes first.

In 2005, I was elected Vice President and served one year. In 2006, I was elected to my first term as club President, and 2008 my second term. I changed my call sign to NJ9T in 2006 and only had one award with that call sign on it at the end of 2009. I was the Parts and Service Manager at a Saturn car dealership, but when GM closed the brand down and we ran out of cars to sell at the end of December 2009 and the dealership was closed. It was winter time and what to do? It was time to play radio again, as I could stay up as late as I wanted. I went to Rick's page and put in my call to see how close to my Masters. To my surprise, I was not that far away.

I had everything for 40 meters, but lacked my CW and RTTY and DX on 75. There was one other that I did not have and that was my Nite Owl on 75, never stayed up that late due to work. The first thing I had to do was get antennas up for the CW and RTTY nets, this was fun with the snow and ice we had this past winter, but got them up and tuned.

I started checking into the 75 meter early net as many nights as I could, looking for DX and a big thanks to Larry K7MI for phone calls when DX showed up and I was not there. I got a list of DX stations that have checked into our nets, and started sending out e-mail inviting them to check into the net. This was more work than I thought, as response was not very good, so we just kept sending out e-mail inviting stations. I went back through all my old logs and found more DX and found the cards in boxes of used cards. With our jammer on 75 it did add more difficulty in getting the contacts. I was also able to get on the 75 late nets and got my Nite Owl award.

While all this was going on, I was checking into the CW and RTTY nets, and having fun. There are so many people to thank for helping me, Randy KJ4JC, Ricky AC7RA, Larry K7MI, and Milt AD5XD. There were many others, but these four made a big difference and I could not have done it without them. I also have to thank all the members that checked into the nets that made it happen and to Gene WM9H for getting the cards to me. When Gene found out I was that close, he would let me know when cards came in and got them to me. I also want to thank my Area Awards Manager Dave KE9OI for checking the awards and Mike K4NOP and Ronnie NC4RS for getting everything processed.

I never really thought about my Masters until I retired, but it was fun getting there, just took 10 years to get there. Where to go from here? When I get time to get back on the radio, six grandkids to watch and events that they are in, time is a little tight. I plan to get back into NCS work, as I enjoy it very much and also the CW and RTTY nets, as they are very enjoyable. I encourage all members to check and see how close you are to your Masters and go for it. I might add, that I have never used a program to do awards, just spread the cards out and start filling in the blanks. After doing this, I would then get on the nets and work the stations that were needed. I guess this is why it took me 10 years to get it done, but it was a fun trip.

Trip report.

My brother John N7JY and I (AD7DB) attended the Miss-Lou Eyeball. John was going on an extensive road trip towing his trailer. He left California in early May, went to the Dayton Hamvention, visited locations in several other states, then came south. I was unable to get that kind of time off of work and so I worked out a plan. I flew on a commercial flight to Baton Rouge and John picked me up at the airport there. We attended the Eyeball, and afterward he dropped me off at the airport again for me to go home.

Wednesday morning I got up early and prepared to leave. I walked one mile to the Flyaway terminal at Van Nuys Airport and rode a bus down to LAX. The first part of my trip was from LAX to Houston. This was a pleasant 3 1/2 hour ride. The George Bush Intercontinental Airport was rather confusing and I got turned around and couldn't at first find the terminal I needed to get to. I eventually did, with plenty of time to spare. More, as it turned out, because the connection flight was delayed over an hour due to thunderstorms around its previous stop (Little Rock). Finally the flight left just after sunset and I arrived at Baton Rouge at 9:15pm.

John was waiting for me as I came down the escalator and we were soon out of the airport. I'd had little to eat all day and so we went to a genuine Southern Waffle House (a little off our route, in Zachary We arrived at the campground in Vidalia LA rather late. I stayed with John in his trailer. Practically everything I needed had already been sent ahead with him.LA). And it was there that I decided to try grits for the first time. (Restaurants in the western U.S. don't tend to serve them.) My verdict? Interesting, but, like okra, I'll take the hash browns next time, thanks.

We arrived at the campground in Vidalia LA rather late. I stayed with John in his trailer. Practically everything I needed had already been sent ahead with him.

The next morning we drove around the area. I'd been prepared to experience high humidity but WOW. It's relentless, even in the middle of the night, and with temperatures in the high 90's it made sense to stay inside with air conditioning. We saw a lot of different plants and trees, a completely different biome from the Southwest. After a short drive up the old Natchez Trace and back, we went over to the Hampton Inn in Natchez to meet the other attendees.

You know the old story about hams that you've known and talked to over the air for years but never met in person. You develop a mental impression of what they look like. Yep, some of them took us by surprise. Some looked a lot older than their voice gave away, and some were a lot younger. Only a few were about as we'd pictured them.

A QRP net was run on 40m SSB, but due to the time of the regular net it had to be cut short. N7JY and I operated as a combo from Louisiana that night and made lots of contacts. I had never been to this part of the country before.

Activities on Friday included breakfast at the Hampton Inn. Then it was over to the Vidalia side of the river for the shrimp and crawfish boil. Now THAT got interesting. The cuisine was reportedly very good according to others but personally it was far too spicy for me. The potatoes were good and even the boiled corn-on-the-cob had a terrific kick to it. The real thing that will

stick in my mind is the sight of Alligator Bill W5WJN helping himself to a truly massive quantity of crawfish!



Afterward it was back over to the Hampton Inn again, for an informative panel session about how our QSL bureaux work. Then there was the club board meeting, which was also very informative.

Next came another 40m QRP net. This is the one N7JY and I had made specific plans for. Two hams, two states, one vehicle. We wanted to each make mobile contact with the other from both states, to eventually help us toward the Clint Wise mobile award. We did it as follows. I checked in as portable MS at the station run by Dean N7XG. John was in his vehicle on the LA side and checked in as mobile. On my turn I made QSO with N7JY/m LA. John then came back to the MS side and a few minutes later he called me during his turn. I hurried out and we swapped places and rechecked with NCS. My next call was 7 minutes after his (due to an asymmetric check in; it was a longer wait from my turn to his than from his turn to mine). I contacted N7JY /p MS while I was mobile MS. Then I drove across the river to LA and parked just south of the bridge. On N7JY's turn, he contacted me while I was mobile LA. I then drove back across the river to the Hampton and rejoined him.

For the regular evening 40m net, we both operated as a combo, mobile from the MS side in the back parking lot of the Hampton - with quite a few others back there as well. Things got exciting when the sprinkler system came on; one maladjusted sprinkler kept repeatedly dousing our vehicle but stopping just short of coming in the windows. The net was winding down when John and I decided to go back to the trailer; our last two contacts were made mobile LA after we had crossed the river again. (If it had been a toll bridge they'd have made a fortune from us.)

On Saturday was another breakfast at the Hampton Inn and then it was time for a 75m QRP net. John and I opted to operate mobile from the Louisiana side. This net was run rodeo style, which made for some rapid-fire excitement.

The Mobile Antenna Shootout was held after that. There were a lot of entries with a considerable assortment of mobile installations. John tried to reclaim his title (he'd been Top Gun in 2004) but it was not to be this time. It was out in the hot sun on a big grassy field; I'd forgotten to put on any sunscreen and my arms got roasted.

Later that afternoon were the awards presentation, prize drawings, and an excellent BBQ banquet. I personally felt pleased that this time each prize was given away to the person whose ticket was drawn; none of this "steal from someone else" that drags out the drawing and makes for bad feelings. I hope this practice will be continued. Alligator Bill must have bought a ton of tickets because he won quite a number of things. There was a great group shot of a bunch of Master Degree Holders; we were fortunate to have so many in attendance.

That evening, John and I operated on the regular 40m net as a combo, mobile in LA.

On Sunday morning we went over to the Hampton one more time for breakfast and to say farewell to others who were leaving. Then John and I decided to take a ride up the Natchez Trace Parkway. We followed it as far as Port Gibson and then went north to Vicksburg to tour the Civil War battlefield. All the monuments and exhibits were very interesting, especially the recovered ironclad USS Cairo. This trip filled up the rest of the day and it was nearly dark by the time we got back to the Natchez area.

On Monday morning we broke camp and headed down to Baton Rouge. John dropped me off curbside right there in the airport (yes, with a 30 foot Airstream in tow) and continued on toward New Orleans.

My trip home was straightforward. Baton Rouge back to Houston, and Houston back to Los Angeles. All my flights were on time, enjoyable, and uneventful. Having only a small shoulder carry-on bag (the one I toted around all of the Eyeball events) I was able to get out of the terminal quickly, and before long I was on the Flyaway bus on the good old 405 for a one hour ride back to the San Fernando Valley in the midst of regular evening L.A. traffic. Then it was the one mile walk from there back to my house. I noticed something right away (besides the air being a lot drier and cooler) was that the people back in L.A. were noticeably more impersonal than all the friendly and polite Southerners I'd met on the trip.

Since I'd had no meal on the flight and only an Egg McMuffin for breakfast in Natchez that day, as soon as I got home I started up my truck and headed over to the nearest In-N-Out Burger for some genuine original Southern California cuisine!



3905 Century Club *2010 Miss-Lou Eyeball* **9th Annual Mobile Shootout**



Mobiles on the Century Club



These are valuable contacts so next time you work a mobile tell them “ thanks for being there “

This year's Mobile Shootout was held on June 12, 2010 at 10:00 AM in Vidalia, LA. There were a total of 19 participants and 10 different brands of antennas. As in the past, the installations were interesting and varied. Of special interest was the installation of the Scorpion antenna on Fred, WB1I's Honda Accord. He utilized a large square of half inch thick aluminum which was attached to the luggage rack on the roof. The plate was well-bonded to the roof with silver coated copper braid at the four corners. The installation demonstrated very well Fred's understanding of proper installation techniques and his score backed that up. Many of the lower scoring entries can be traced directly to improper installation techniques such as low mounting on trailer hitches where ground losses are high, small main coils with low "Q", as well as main coils near vehicle sheet metal as a cause for even more losses. I do not make that statement disrespectfully, just as a matter of observation and fact. After all, the ultimate test of a mobile installation is whether or not you can hear and be heard and everyone in the shootout has made contacts on the nets at one time or another – it's just a matter of what you would rather hear, "Nothing Heard" or a 3-3 (that's the difference between last and 1st place).

New this year is a column that indicates the difference in dB between each individual score and the high score. Keep in mind that if 6dB is one S-Unit, the low score, in reality, would only be two S-Units down from the high score. Of course even one S-Unit can mean the difference between being heard and not being heard if your signal is at or below the noise level.

Also new this year, after the first table which includes all participants, are three additional tables which make it easy to compare the results of similar types of antennas. Hopefully this will make it easier to compare your antenna to the leader in your particular group. If you want to maximize your mobile signal, please visit <http://www.k0bg.com/> and follow Alan's instructions; he knows what he's talking about.

Special thanks to Ray, K5RFF for helping out Doug, WØWSP and taking so many pictures of the entrants mobile setups. Those pictures will be very informative for anyone wanting to compare their particular mobile setup with other similar setups to see what may have made the difference. Also thanks go to Bill, N3WD and Dwayne, KD4POJ for help with the scoring. A huge thank you to Doug, WØWSP who moved the test setup from vehicle to vehicle in 95+ degree, 80% humidity weather –this was not an easy task, but Doug's involvement was critical to the success of the shootout and I thank him very much.








