Speaking of DX

Marty (AG5T) has been working behind the scenes inviting DX stations to check into our nets. Marty gives us a peek at how he handles the language barrier.



How to practice your Spanish (and invite DX stations) and other languages - Marty AG5T


 \mathbf{I} 've used an internet function called Google Translate to invite DX stations. Here's how

I first type the paragraph in English such as the following:

Hello, my name is Marty and my call sign is AG5T. I'd like to invite you to the 3905 Century Club nets.

You will see two sides. Select English on the left and lets say Spanish, on the right.

Enter the English paragraph and then watch as it shows up in Spanish on the right. HOW-EVER, we need to do one more step. We need to check in reverse!



Copy and paste the Spanish side and move it to the left side. Change the language to Spanish. You will then need to change the right side to English. Read the English carefully as it might contain "broken" English or incorrect phrases. The ham radio word for "net" is redes in Spanish, but translates as networks in English. You may have to do some trial and error but most of the phrasing will be translated pretty close. As for "networks" I simply replace the word redes on the Spanish side with the word net and it will show up as "net" on the English. Most Spanish speaking hams know what the word "net" means.

Play around with it and you'll start figuring out certain words you can change. You can also try translating single words as a test.

See the cheat sheet in the box on the left. Thanks to AL (VK4BL). Below is a "Three Day SFI and A-Index Forecast from dx.qsl.net.

D	ate	SFI	A-index
01	Aug	74	12
02	Aug	72	8
03	Aug	72	5

Looks like the A-Index is headed in the right direction, but the SFI not so much!

Cheat notes (for the non readers)

The A index [LOW is GOOD]

- · 1 to 6 best
- · 7 to 9 is OK
- · 11 or more not so good

K index [LOW is GOOD]

- · 0 or 1 best
- · 2 is OK
- · 3 or more not so good
- · 5 is really terrible

SFI index [HIGH is GOOD]

- · 70 not good
- · 80 good
- · 90 better
- · 100+ best


